COMPASSION INTERNATIONAL - In response to the Great Commission, Compassion International exists as an advocate for children, to release them from their spiritual, economic, social and physical poverty and enable them to become responsible and fulfilled Christian adults. Today, Compassion helps more than 800,000 children in 24 countries. Our church in Naga City sponsors 125 children from families in dire poverty. While the children are taught biblical principles, their families are in the main auditorium with the pastor for a worship service.

Naga City Bible Church is our oldest church, founded in 1975. Pastor and Mrs. Juancito Sayson ministered here for many years. Pastor and Mrs. Jun Nacion have been serving in Naga for over 9 years. Please pray for Pastor Nacion as he ministers to the community. Also, pray for Mrs. Nacion and the staff who work weekly with the Compassion children. Pastor Nacion tells me that over 50 adults have received Christ as a result of the ministry they have for the children.

OUR COMPASSION INTERNATIONAL CHILDREN - The Adult Bible Fellowship where I teach at Redeemer Bible Church in Dallas supports a young man in the Philippines - Engleburt - and one of the class members supports another young man - Joseph.

"We had our BEE class with Dr. John Dreisback's students. We are halfway through Romans/Galatians with 4 hours weekly meeting. I will be in Cavite today, after our Saturday BEE class in the morning, to baptize a number of new believers in Cavite church with Willy and Thelma Joven. I will be their speaker this coming Sunday on their 10th year church anniversary."

Pastor Joey is doing a great job representing BEE as the head of BEE Philippines. We are delighted with the progress of the BEE ministry and owe a great deal to Pastor Joey for opening new areas of ministry for our mission.

A NEW OPPORTUNITY - I recently was contacted by EvanTell, an evangelistic ministry headed by Larry Moyer. David Souther, the International director, has suggested that we partner with them and start printing their tracts and materials in Tagalog and other Filipino languages. Pray with us that this ministry will work out for us and develop into something that brings many souls to Christ. The major tracts being use incorporates the Bad News/Good News approach.

The Bad News/Good News approach is an easy way to present the gospel. There are 4 points to remember and 4 Scripture verses to support them.

1. Bad News #1- We are all sinners. (Romans 3:23)
2. Bad News #2 - The penalty for sin is death. (Romans 6:23)
3. Good News #1 - Christ died for you. (Romans 5:8)
4. Good News #2 - You can be saved through faith in Christ. (Ephesians 2:8-9)

BEE STUDENTS IN THE BICAL REGION - Pastor Jun Nacion writes: "Regarding the BEE in Naga, We have 34 students enrolled in APOLOGETICS. This is the largest group we have had for BEE class. Pastor Zuniega will open the Romans and Galatian class. Ptr. Rod will Teach Romans and Galatian to the young people of the Church. Finally, we have BEE in different places in Bicol. Pastor Dan will continue the BEE in Iriga. Pastor Jimmy Bayaban is now starting in Tabaco. He has 6 students now. I have given Pastor Guillermo Padillia the Material of Apologetics for him to start BEE in Labo, Camarines Norte. And lastly, Pastor Genilo of Iloilo city Baptist Church will also start BEE in his Church."

TEACHING - I suppose no one likes to teach as much as I do. One of the great privileges I have as a missionary is teaching at many different venues. I like the preparation, the questions and the personal one-on-one times I have with students. Thank you for making it possible for me to teach not only in the Dallas area, but also worldwide. I have had and have the privilege of teaching in the Philippines, Dallas, Jordan, Hungary, & . Sri Lanka.

INTERNATIONAL GRADUATE SCHOOL OF LEADERSHIP - Let me share some of the facts regarding the seminary where I taught this summer:

* 560 - The number of graduates now serving in 34 countries of the world, mostly in South-East Asia

* 705 - The number of people who indicated their desire to trust in Christ following the internships done across the Philippines by the students in just the last few months.

* 17 - The number of nationalities I had the privilege to teach in the months of May and June. They are from Bangladesh, Bhutan, China, India, Indonesia, Korea, Laos, Myanmar, Nepal, Pakistan, Philippines, Romania, Taiwan, Thailand, Tibet, USA, and Vietnam.

PASTOR AND MRS. JUN NACION WRITE ABOUT BUILDING NEEDS - Thank you for representing our ministry in the United States where through you we got opportunities to partner with the EvanTell and Pastor Go so we can improve our ministries here in Bicol. The ministry in Iriga is doing very well. She is growing in number and the membership is responding well to pastor Dan and Rico. And they are positive to the Word of God. However, I would admit that there is a problem on the building project because the original plan was not followed. Now it is not yet useful for the Church. When I went there, I estimated that we still need 150 thousand pesos (\$3,000) in order that the building can be useful. This money is for the finishing of the slab roofing, for the cemented side walls (only the back side of the pulpit area is finished), for window grills, for cemented flooring, doors and painting. If there will be funds in the future for Iriga I promised you that I will personally handle the project. If we can finished this building it will be very useful for a long period of time because it is a cemented structure. We will be following up the title of the property as well but rest assured that we will not lose it. We love you and miss you, Pastor Nadon and Nenita
